ROBERT K. RUPP, J.D. CHAIRMAN, BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Dear Friends of OPHP:

During 2009 we saw a number of changes at the Ohio Physicians Health Program (OPHP). Dr. Stanley G. Sateren, who served as OPHP's Medical Director and President since October 2002, retired in early

2009. Dr. Sateren was our first full time Medical Director and was responsible for building the program over the last seven years to what it is today. Under his leadership, the program grew from 368 active cases in 2003 to 480 active cases in 2008. Dr. Sateren also recruited an exceptionally talented and hardworking staff.

Although we will miss our good friend Dr. Sateren, on May 1, 2009, we were delighted to welcome Dr. Peter D. Rogers, M.D., MPH, FASAM, as OPHP's new Medical Director and President. Dr. Rogers is an experienced addictionologist and a Diplomat of the American Board of Addiction Medicine. Beyond his commitment to excellence, his more than 25 years of experience treating patients with addictions, and his history of helping physicians with health issues, Dr. Rogers truly has a passion for physicians' health and for the work of OPHP. We are very fortunate to have such a committed expert leading our program.

In 2009 (and early 2010) we also added six new board members: Dr. Patricia Davidson (an Anesthesiologist who is a former member of the Ohio State Medical Board), Dr. Bruce Wall M.D., M.M.M. (chief executive of OSU health plans), Margaret Tondow (member of the Cincinnati Academy of Medicine Alliance), Dr. James Keller, M.D. (retired physician), Dr. Ronald Miller, M.D. (internal medicine) and Dr. Christina Delos-Reyes, M.D. (psychiatrist). I am looking forward to working with each of our new board members.

I believe that our new Medical Director and our new Board members will help further our mission to "facilitate the health and wellness of health care professionals in order to enhance patient safety." OPHP is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization that serves as

a confidential resource for physicians, residents, medical students, and other health care professionals whose health is being affected by substance use disorders or other issues. We assist colleagues, family members, group practices, health systems, and hospitals who have concerns about physicians and other health care professionals and their ability to practice with reasonable skill and safety to patients. Studies show that when physicians have the support and assistance of a program like OPHP they recover from substance use disorders in the range of 90% compared to a rate of 25% - 30% for the general population. About 70% of OPHP's active cases involve substance use disorders. The other 30% relate to other matters affecting the health and wellness of medical professionals, such as psychiatric and mental illness, aging, disruptive behavior, boundary issues, stress and others.

The economic downturn during 2009 affected OPHP like it affected many other businesses. We are extremely grateful to the Ohio Medical Quality Foundation, our largest supporter, for its continued financial support during this difficult time. We are also grateful to the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services which continued to provide funding that enables OPHP to provide educational seminars throughout the State to raise awareness of substance use disorders, the OPHP program and how it can assist professionals and organizations. Finally, we are grateful for the financial contributions we received from 63 hospitals and medical staffs, 84 individuals and six other organizations. These contributions have helped to sustain us during a very difficult economic time. You have supported OPHP and we are working to support as many health care professionals as we can.

For physicians experiencing difficulties, call us. Our Medical Director and staff can assist you. They are knowledgeable about resources that can provide help and they are knowledgeable about our State Medical Board and the requirements of its rules and regulations in this area.

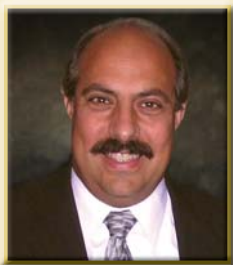

2009 YEAR IN REVIEW

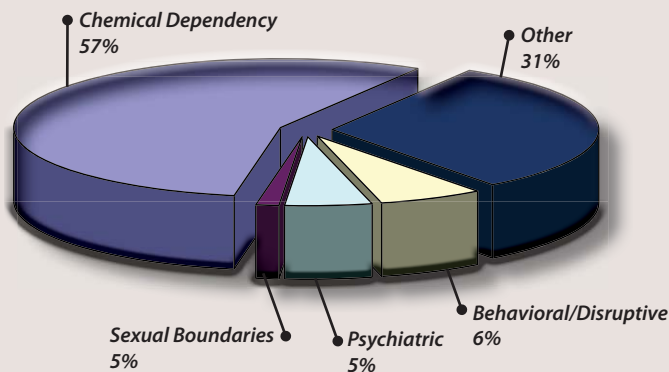
During the year the Ohio Physicians Health Program (OPHP) is contacted by a variety of individuals and institutions that have a concern about the health and well being of a healthcare practitioner or medical student. Though the majority of these contacts deal with concern about a possible substance use disorder, there are increasing numbers of contacts regarding stress and burnout; aging; depression; disruptive behaviors; psychiatric or mental illness; practice re-entry; professional boundaries; and professional sexual misconduct.

Many cases do not require a signed monitoring agreement as the issues or concerns are addressed in various ways such as through referral for professional evaluation and/or treatment, education, coaching, support, etc.

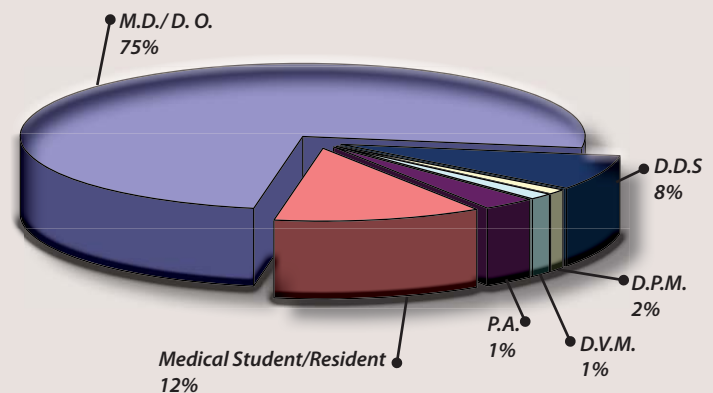
Most signed agreements are for monitoring and recovery documentation of a healthcare professional with a substance use disorder. Some of these participants may also have a co-occurring disorder, dual diagnosis, or other issues impacting their health and recovery.

The charts below contain the percentages of all signed OPHP agreements by professional degree and the breakdown of the reason for initial contact with OPHP.

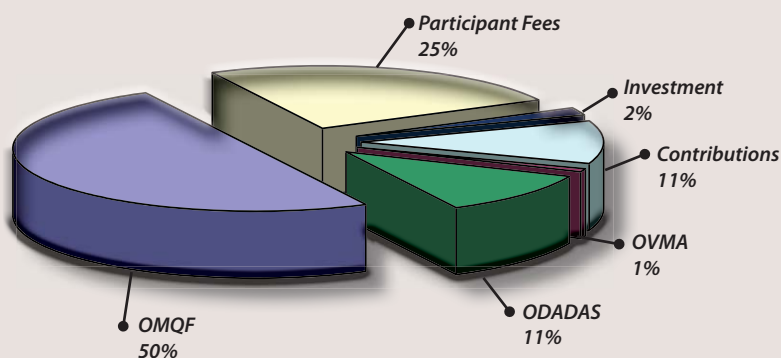
REASONS FOR INITIAL CONTACT



AGREEMENTS BY PROFESSIONAL DEGREE

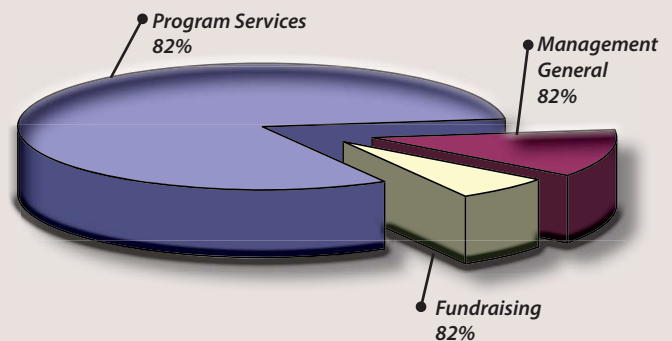


2009 REVENUE SOURCES



The Ohio Physicians Health Program's major source of funding is the Ohio Medical Quality Foundation (OMQF), providing 50 percent of total revenue in 2009. Participant fees accounted for 25 percent of OPHP's revenue in 2009. Other organizations providing financial support include the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS) and the Ohio Veterinary Medical Association (OMVA). Individual and institutional financial support, which includes annual giving, provided 11 percent of OPHP's total revenue.

2009 FUNCTIONAL EXPENSES



The Ohio Physicians Health Program is a responsible steward in the use of its resources as reflected in this functional expense pie chart. In 2009, 82 percent of OPHP's operational expense was in the actual delivery of services to physicians, residents, medical students, dentists, veterinarians, other healthcare professionals, hospitals, medical staff leaders, medical schools, and others.
