RAYMOND R. MAZZOTTA
CHAIRMAN, OPHP BOARD OF TRUSTEES

It is an honor and a privilege to serve as the new Chairman of the Ohio Physicians Health Program (OPHP) Board of Trustees. During 2010 we had a number of changes at the organization. Longstanding board members that completed their terms of

service with the board include: Molly A. Katz, M.D. (13 years); David D. Goldberg, D.O. (14 years); and Robert K. Rupp, J.D. (13 years). Mr. Rupp served as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees since 2001 and will be greatly missed at the organization.

I am delighted that Dr. David D. Goldberg has been selected to serve as Medical Director for OPHP in 2011. Dr. Goldberg is Board Certified in Addiction Medicine and Family Practice Medicine. He is a member of the American Society of Addiction Medicine and has over 20 years of experience in addiction medicine.

In 2010 (and early 2011) we added seven new board members: Bruce Wall M.D., M.M.M., Margaret Tondow, James Keller, M.D., Ronald Miller, M.D., Christina Delos-Reyes, M.D., Steven A. Clay, D.O., and Mark Hatcher, J.D. I am excited about the expertise, knowledge and depth the new members bring to the Board and organization.

OPHP had a successful year in 2010 working with physicians and other healthcare professionals in Ohio. There were 432 active cases and 165 new referrals throughout the year. While referrals continue to be predominately substance abuse related, we saw a 50% increase in referrals for disruptive behavior. Statistics

through 2010 reflect a 95% recovery rate for the participants in our program. I believe this rate to be indicative of quality services available at OPHP provided by a very dedicated staff.

We are extremely grateful to the Ohio Medical Quality Foundation, our largest supporter, for its continued financial support. Their grant has allowed OPHP to expand our services to include a multitude of healthcare professionals, organizations, and associations. We currently serve: physicians, residents, medical students, physician assistants, dentists, dental hygienists, veterinarians, optometrists, and others.

We are also grateful to the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS) which continued to provide funding for our educational presentations given throughout the state. These lectures provide healthcare professionals information on physician health and substance use disorders, Ohio's "One-Bite Rule", and services available through OPHP. In 2010, over 1,100 healthcare professionals attended an OPHP presentation. Surveys reflect that over 95% of program attendees committed to applying the information gained in their profession.

Finally, we are grateful for the financial contributions we received from 53 hospitals and medical staffs, 88 individuals and 18 other organizations. These donations help ensure that OPHP is able to provide services to healthcare professionals and continue its mission to *"facilitate the health and wellness of healthcare professionals in order to enhance patient safety"*. 2010 YEAR IN REVIEW

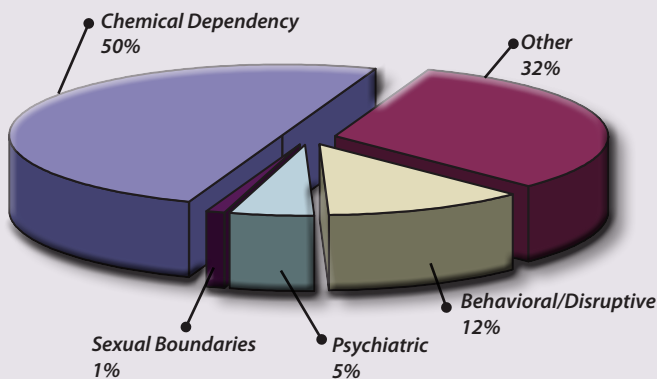
Throughout the year the Ohio Physicians Health Program (OPHP) is contacted by a variety of individuals and institutions that have a concern about the health and well being of a physician, resident, medical student, physician assistant, dentist, veterinarian or other healthcare practitioner. Though the majority of these contacts deal with concern about a possible substance use disorder, there are increasing numbers of contacts regarding disruptive behavior, stress and burnout; depression; psychiatric or mental illness; practice re-entry; professional boundaries; and professional sexual misconduct.

Many cases do not require a signed monitoring agreement as the issues or concerns are addressed in various ways such as through referral for professional evaluation and/or treatment, education, coaching, support, etc.

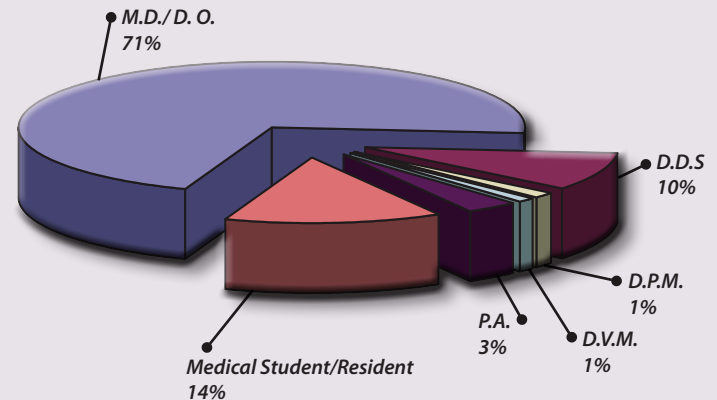
Most signed agreements are for monitoring and recovery documentation of a healthcare professional with a substance use disorder. Some of these participants may also have a co-occurring disorder, dual diagnosis, or other issues impacting their health and recovery.

The charts below contain the percentages of all signed OPHP agreements by professional degree and the breakdown of the reason for initial contact with OPHP in 2010.

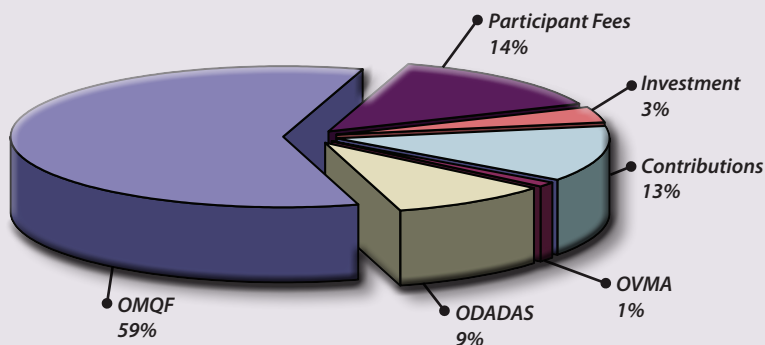
REASONS FOR INITIAL CONTACT



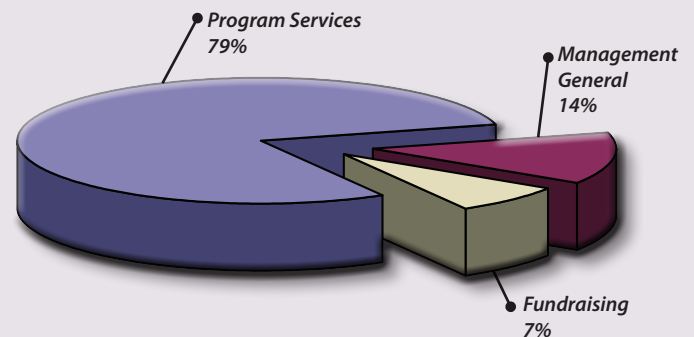
AGREEMENTS BY PROFESSIONAL DEGREE

The Ohio Physicians Health Program's major source of funding is the Ohio Medical Quality Foundation (OMQF), providing 59 percent of total revenue in 2010. Participant fees accounted for 14 percent of OPHP's revenue in 2010. Other organizations providing financial support include the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS) and the Ohio Veterinary Medical Association (OMVA). Individual and institutional financial support, which includes annual giving, provided 13 percent of OPHP's total revenue.

The Ohio Physicians Health Program is a responsible steward in the use of its resources as reflected in this functional expense pie chart. In 2010, 79 percent of OPHP's operational expense was in the actual delivery of services to physicians, residents, medical students, dentists, veterinarians, other healthcare professionals, hospitals, medical staff leaders, medical schools, and others.
