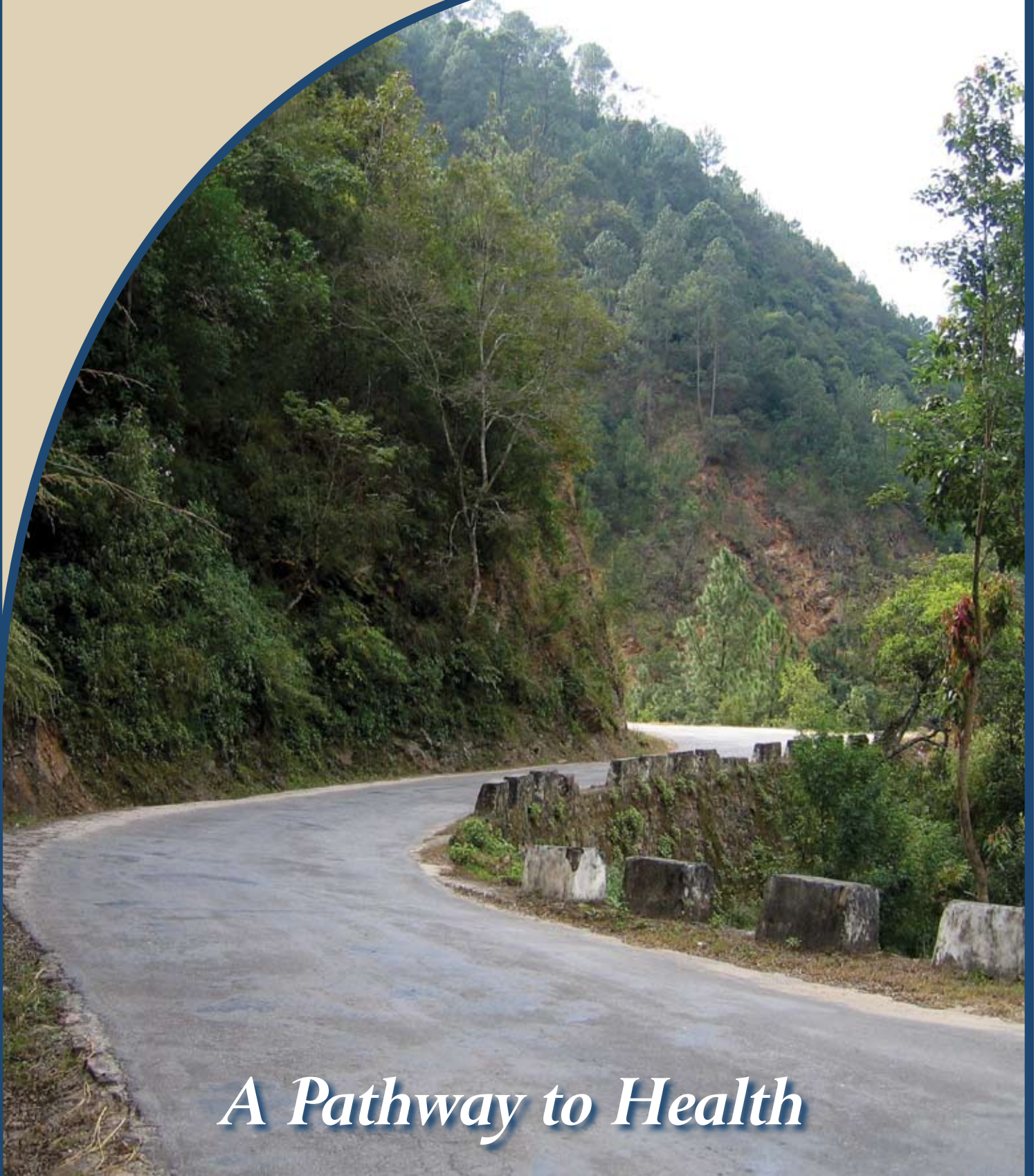

Dear Friends of OPHP:

I would like to thank you for your support to the Ohio Physicians Health Program. As a charitable organization, OPHP depends upon the support and assistance of many dedicated people and organizations whose missions are to promote the health of Ohio's physicians.

OPHP is a different organization today compared to five or six years ago including a name change to "Ohio Physicians Health Program" to indicate our focus on "health". Since 2000 OPHP has had a 100% increase in the number of participants, from 237 to 473.

There have also been significant changes in the program itself. OPHP doesn't only monitor physicians with substance use disorders, and OPHP isn't just an advocacy organization that "stands up" for healthcare professionals in front of the medical board and other licensing boards. Of course, those are still an important part of what we do. Today OPHP is more holistic in its pursuit of the health of its participants. It now assists in working through many issues besides alcohol or substance use, such as problems related to aging, disruptive behavior, depression, or other mental disorders.

We have continuously had the great support of the Ohio Medical Quality Foundation, which has not only supported us financially but also provided valuable guidance and foresight as we have grown.

**A**s I write my contribution to this year's Annual Report, I am keenly aware of the privilege it is to serve as part of the Ohio Physicians Health Program (OPHP) and its mission, *to facilitate the health and wellness of healthcare professionals in order to enhance patient safety*. What is detailed in this report would not have been possible without the work of an outstanding staff, numerous committed volunteers, loyal supporters and contributors, and a dedicated Board of Trustees.

I want to thank Robert K. Rupp, J.D., Chairman of the OPHP Board of Trustees, for the one-on-one leadership and guidance he so freely provides to me and his commitment to the organization. OPHP could not have grown into the organization it is today without the expertise and dedication of the Officers and Trustees of the board, and I express my sincere gratitude for their willingness to be a part of this important organization and its mission.

A theme for this year's report is roads or paths to convey the message that roads or paths assist individuals on a journey, in this context a journey toward healing, health, and well being. Accompanying the pictures throughout this report are some of the many unsolicited comments received by OPHP during 2007. These quotes are like brush strokes of a painting that communicates the importance and value of the services provided by OPHP to physicians and other healthcare professionals as well as hospitals, medical staffs, and medical colleges throughout Ohio.

The graphs under the Year in Review section of this report reflect the activities and services provided during 2007. Requests and demands for these services continue to grow each year with a 239% increase for the year 2000. Physicians enrolled with OPHP for monitoring and recovery documentation services are experiencing recovery rates as good as or better than those reported in the medical literature.

The Ohio Medical Quality Foundation (OMQF) is OPHP's primary funding source and in 2007 it awarded a three year grant for 2008 - 2010. Other major funding is received from the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS) and OHIC Insurance Company. OPHP's relationship with ODADAS makes possible the extensive educational lecture program (page 13) delivered to Ohio physicians, medical students and other health care professionals, and the dissemination of other important communication forwarding both organizations' missions.

The **Winter - Spring 2007-2008 Newsletter** acknowledges the many individuals and institutions that provided funding and other forms of support during 2007, reflecting the success of the OPHP fund development program. OPHP receives comments and notes of

appreciation throughout the year regarding the valuable information and resources for physicians and others in the healthcare field that is provided in its Newsletters.

I continue to serve as a director of the Central Region of the Federation of State Physician Health Programs (FSPHP) and on its Board of Trustees, the planning committee for the FSPHP annual meeting, and other board committees. This allows OPHP and its participants to benefit from current knowledge and developments in the field of physician health.

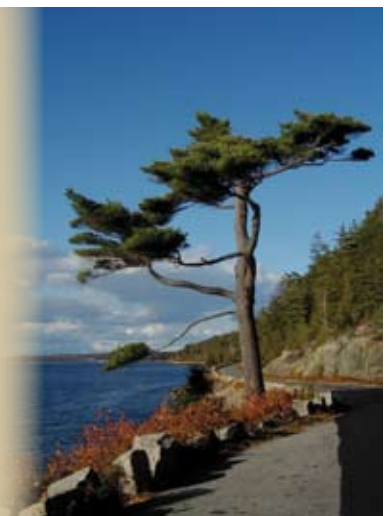

The Ohio Physicians Health Program (OPHP) is a confidential resource for physicians, veterinarians, dentists, residents, medical students, other health-care professionals, group practices, health systems, hospitals, and family members or colleagues who have concerns about a physician or other healthcare professional's health and well being. These may include:

- Substance Use Disorders
- Behavioral Health
- Mental Health
- Stress
- Burnout
- Aging
- Physical Illness

OPHP provides assistance through consultation, identification, intervention, referral, and case management which may include monitoring and recovery documentation.

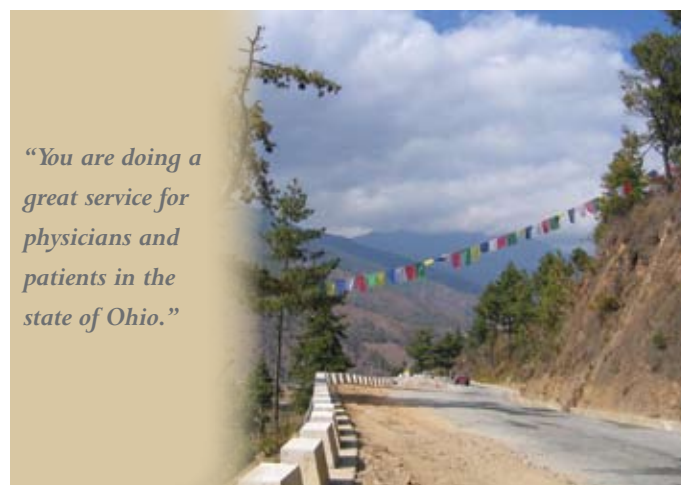

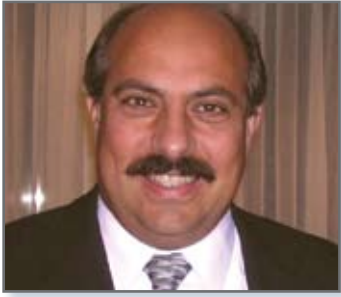

*Public Relations*

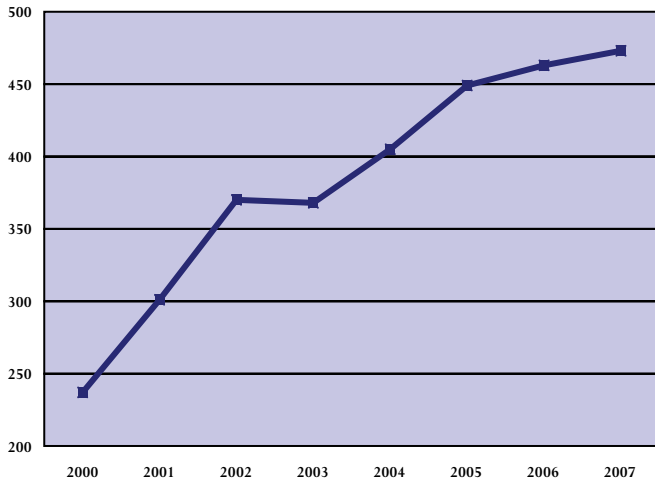

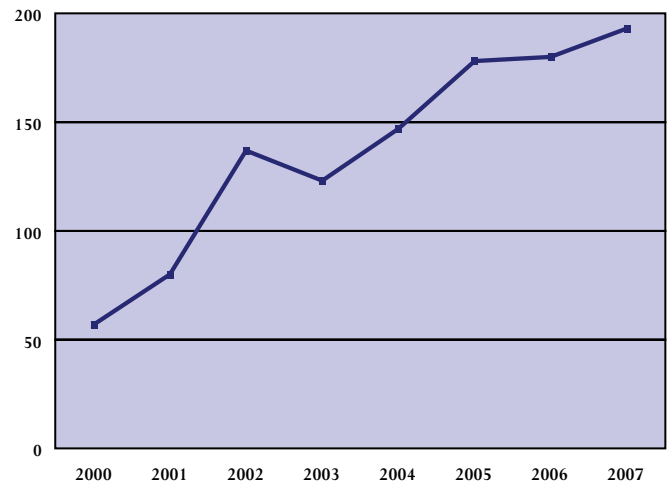
# 2007 Year in Review

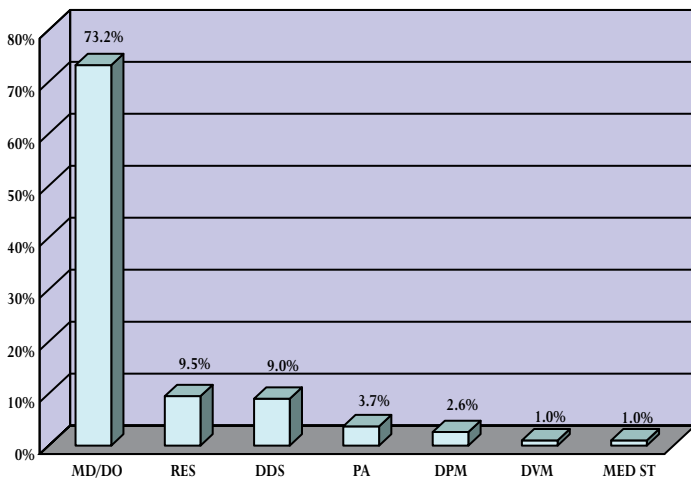
**Ohio Physicians Health Program**  
Active Annual Cases



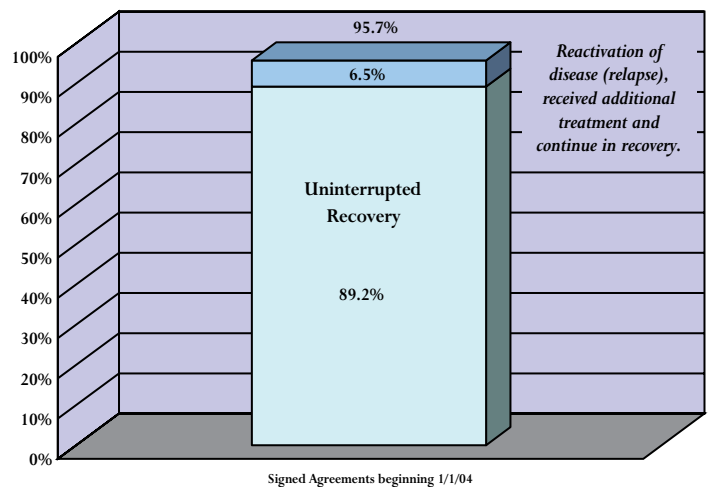
**Ohio Physicians Health Program**

Percent of Total

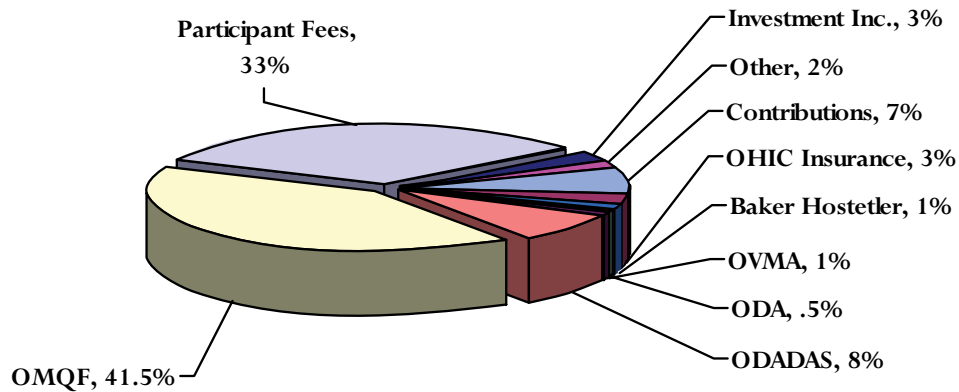

Physician Recovery



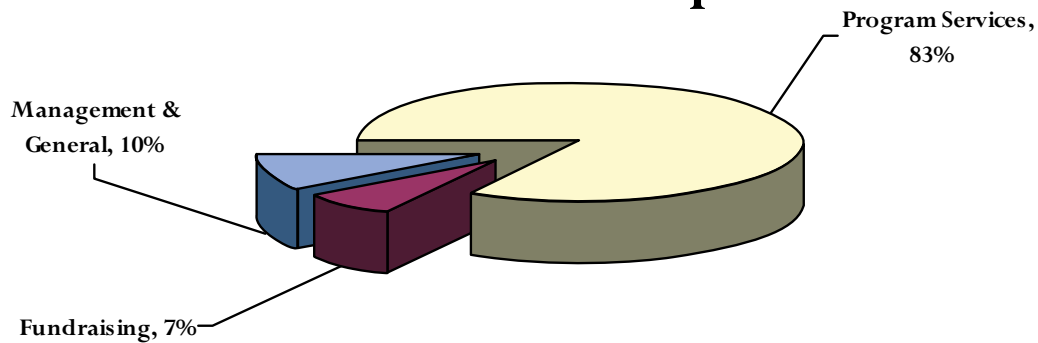
# 2007 Year in Review

## 2007 Revenue Sources



The Ohio Physicians Health Program's major source of funding is the Ohio Medical Quality Foundation (OMQF), providing 41.5 percent of total revenue in 2007. Participant fees accounted for 33 percent of OPHP's revenue in 2007. Other organizations providing financial support include the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services (ODADAS), OHIC Insurance Company, Ohio Dental Association (ODA), Ohio Veterinary Medical Association (OMVA), and Baker & Hostetler LLP. Individual and institutional financial support, which includes annual giving, provided 7 percent of OPHP's total revenue.

## 2007 Functional Expenses



The Ohio Physicians Health Program is a responsible steward in the use of its resources as reflected in this functional expense pie chart. In 2007, 83 percent of OPHP's operational expense was in the actual delivery of services to physicians, residents, medical students, dentists, veterinarians, other healthcare professionals, hospitals, medical staff leaders, medical schools, and others.

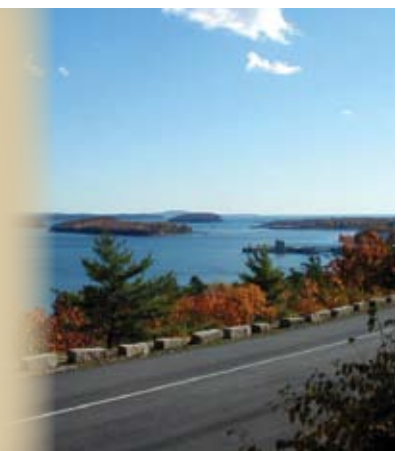


