## IDAA OFFERS HELP TO RECOVERING DOCTORS

Okay. So what? What is IDAA anyway? Who are these people and what are they all about?

International Doctors in Alcoholics Anonymous (IDAA) is a fellowship of doctors and their families whose primary purpose is to support one another in recovery from alcoholism and other drug addictions. IDAA membership includes over 5,000 women and men worldwide. The majority of IDAA members have M.D. or D.O. degrees. However, any doctor in the healthcare professions is eligible to join. All members have, or are in preparation for doctorate degrees in the health care, including fields such as dentistry, psychology, and veterinary science, as well as medicine. Doctors who attend Al-Anon may also be members.

What does IDAA do? The IDAA organization provides support and encouragement through the study and application of the steps and traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous, the annual IDAA meeting, and education and ongoing network development within the tradition of anonymity. IDAA does not provide professional counseling, therapy or treatment.

IDAA strongly supports mainstream AA as the basis for everyone's recovery program. IDAA believes that specific issues do arise for healthcare professionals that are hard to deal with in regular AA meetings. It is hard to discuss "doctor anger," patient confidentiality, practice and legal issues in open AA. Differences in education and status keep many doctors out of regular AA early on, and these barriers are addressed in IDAA.

As an expression of their life work, and as a team devoted to sustaining and enriching the health and wellbeing of healthcare professionals and their families, they have established *The Stan Sateren, MD and Linda Stoer-Scaggs, PhD Family Healing and Support Fund* to support this important work.

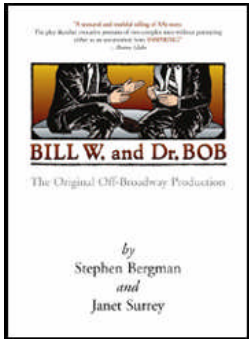
## “THINK OUTSIDE THE STIGMA”

Issues such as professional shame and fear of failure as a doctor, malpractice issues, lack of money, and licensure problems are often difficult for doctors and others in the healthcare professions who are new in recovery. Local doctor and caduceus groups are often monitored, making it difficult to discuss many issues of concern to a recovering doctor.

Attending the AA meeting, and observing hundreds of other recovering doctors of all kinds, helps greatly in dealing with the shame and helps doctors to do whatever necessary to achieve sobriety. The fellowship and the hearing of inspiring experiences and stories from others, who may have even worse problems, facilitates healing and commitment to recovery. It may even help restore one's professional reputation. A most significant benefit is help with families and increasing awareness of how the disease of alcoholism may affect relationships and family members including breaking the family cycle of addiction.


How do I learn more about IDAA? Easy, [www.IDAA.org](http://www.IDAA.org) will take you there in a cyber-second. (Or should I say so-ber-second?) This web site provides information and resources for prospective and current members along with their family and friends—information on the organization, including a directory of professional meetings and a newsletter archives, and links to other resources for recovery.

What about anonymity? There is only one strictly confidential listing of members, and the Executive Director in the IDAA Central Office holds this. Any communication with individual members occurs only with the permission of both parties.

## PRESCRIPTION DRUGS BLAMED FOR RISING OVERDOSE DEATHS

Unintentional poisoning deaths rose from 12,186 in 1999 to 20,950 in 2004, and the increase is largely being attributed to overdoses on prescription drugs, the Los Angeles Times reported Jan. 26.

Ninety-five percent of unintentional poisoning deaths are drug overdoses; in recent years, prescription-drug overdoses have overtaken cocaine and heroin overdoses as the leading cause of poisoning deaths, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) said. In fact, a recent spike in prescription-drug overdoses is the cause of the first increase in the nation's injury death rate in 25 years, according to CDC injury-prevention expert Len Paulozzi.

Most overdose deaths are due to opioid painkillers like oxycodone, fentanyl, and methadone. But other prescription drugs also can cause fatal overdoses, such as sleeping pills, antidepressants, and tranquilizers. Overdoses from the latter group of drugs increased 84 percent between 1999 and 2004, the CDC said.

Overall, sales of prescription drugs have increased almost 500 percent since 1990.

## STRUGGLING IN SILENCE:

### *Physician Depression and Suicide*

The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention has funded a new educational multi-media campaign which includes a one hour public television special with the above title. The first component of the campaign is this hour-long documentary featuring interviews with families and friends that have been touched by a physician's suicide. Physicians speak candidly about personal battles with depression. The documentary will be presented by KCET-TV, a public television station for Southern and Central California in early spring 2008 and then later will air on **PBS stations nationwide.**
